Contest Rules:

- ✎ Each university or school may submit one (1) entry. Groups of students from one or more engineering disciplines are encouraged to collaborate on a single entry.
- ✎ Your video or slideshow presentation must be two minutes or less in length. The following formats are recommended: (greater than 320w x 240h)
 - ✎ Apple: .mov, .mp4
 - ✎ Flash: .flv, f4v
 - ✎ Windows: .wmv
- ✎ Entries must creatively show the story of why your school or university is THE BEST at using your engineering talents to make a difference in your community. Judges will be looking for:
 - ✎ Creativity
 - ✎ Stories that show how students are coming together and combining different engineering disciplines to make their mark on the world
 - ✎ Stories that show how students at your engineering school collectively demonstrate your university's passion for community service and engagement
- ✎ Celebrity judges will be introduced on the live, national Webcast.
